

Engineering Undergraduate Research Program (EURP) Scholars Graduate Tuition Benefit

Description

The College of Engineering has agreed to cover the first semester of in-state graduate tuition for any EURP Scholars participant who stays for graduate school under an MS Plan A (thesis option) or PhD program. MS Plan C (coursework only) students are ineligible.

This benefit can only be applied towards coursework (not thesis credits), and the courses must count towards the student's degree requirements as listed on their Plan of Study (no extra-curriculars).

Instructions

Complete the following items and email to <Ryan.Berke@usu.edu>:

1. The application form (see the following page), including a list of which courses you will take during the semester for which you are requesting the tuition benefit.
2. A draft Plan of Study form which includes the courses for which you are requesting the tuition benefit in context of the rest of your expected degree plan. This draft does not need to be approved by your full committee, but should be approved by your advisor.
3. A brief description (1 page or less) of your degree plan which addresses:
 - a. Brief summary of your research topic written for a non-expert audience
 - b. How does your graduate research align with your EURP Scholars project?
 - c. If you are changing advisors, why is the new one a better fit for your career goals?
